I want to once again thank all the CCC Members who helped make this year a good one. Also, special thanks to Jim Frasinetti for his help in organizing the Christmas Party.


I will have more info regarding this years CCC Car Shows as well other special events and car shows in next months issue of the newsletter. In the meantime contact me with any shows or events that interest you.

Legislative Report

The repeal the gas tax petitions have been distributed and will be available at local shopping canters and Walmart's around the Greater Sacramento area.

I encourage you all to sign the petition to end this outrageous gas tax and vehicle registration fee increases.



We are already suffering from the highest gas prices in the nation and on January 1 2018 the vehicle registration fees will increase and average of \$125.00 on top of what we currently pay. It will coat the average California driver more than \$700.00 per year.

New Laws Effective January 1, 2018!

Hello,

Just a few bills that were passed into law and will be effective January 1, 2018 or sooner!

1. SB-1: increases your gas taxes by approximately gas 12 cents diesel 20 Cents (Nov 1 - per gallon) and your vehicle license fees by an average of \$100 on top of what you pay now (Jan 1st).

Gas Tax Repeal Petition Instructions

Thank you for helping to repeal the Car and Gas Tax in California by signing the attached petition. Many petitions are thrown out because voters did not fill theirs out properly – **so to ensure your petition counts, please read and follow these instructions carefully.**

STEP 1 - PRINT

Print out the petition (see next page). Do not change the size of the form or adjust margins.

Just print as is. You must fill out the petition with a PEN – preferably black or blue pen.

You may have signed up to pledge to sign the petition online – but the **ONLY** signature that really counts is a signature with a pen on paper of the form you are printing off in this packet.

The attached petition (see next page) is the only official form for you to sign.

STEP 2 – SIGN IN TWO PLACES

You will need to sign in **TWO PLACES** on this petition. Why? Because you are technically both signing the petition and circulating the petition.

To sign the petition, go to block one. Print your first and last name, print your street address where you are legally registered to vote, and include your zip code. Then **SIGN** your name in this block. Please do **NOT** write in the column that says “This Column for official use only.”

You must also sign the portion for the **CIRCULATOR** – since you are downloading this form you are considered a “circulator” as well as a “signer.” In the Declaration of Circulator box, print your name, and put today’s date in all date fields. Sign this Circulator block again and write the county you live in.

STEP 3: MAIL BACK THE PETITION

INITIATIVE MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED DIRECTLY TO THE VOTERS

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following circulating title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure: **(17-0033 Amdt. #1) ELIMINATES RECENTLY ENACTED ROAD REPAIR AND TRANSPORTATION FUNDING BY REPEALING REVENUES DEDICATED FOR THOSE PURPOSES. REQUIRES ANY MEASURE TO ENACT CERTAIN VEHICLE FUEL TAXES AND VEHICLE FEES BE SUBMITTED TO AND APPROVED BY THE ELECTORATE. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.** Repeals a 2017 transportation law's tax and fee provisions that pay for repairs and improvements to local roads, state highways, and public transportation. Requires the Legislature to submit any measure enacting specified taxes or fees on gas or diesel fuel, or on the privilege to operate a vehicle on public highways, to the electorate for approval. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local government: Reduced annual state transportation tax revenues of \$2.9 billion in 2018-19, increasing to \$4.9 billion annually by 2020-21. These revenues would primarily have supported state highway maintenance and rehabilitation, local streets and roads, and mass transit. In addition, potentially lower transportation tax revenues in the future from requiring voter approval of such tax increases, with the impact dependent on future actions by the Legislature and voters.

To the Honorable Secretary of State of California:

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of the county identified herein, hereby propose amendments to the California Constitution, relating to increases in the gas and car tax and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special statewide election held prior to that general election or as otherwise provided by law. The proposed constitutional amendments (full title and text of the measure) read as follows:

SECTION 1. STATEMENT OF FINDINGS AND PURPOSES

- (a) California's taxes on gasoline and car ownership are among the highest in the nation.
- (b) These taxes have been raised without the consent of the people.
- (c) Therefore, the people hereby amend the Constitution to require voter approval of the recent increase in the gas and car tax enacted by Chapter 5 of the Statutes of 2017 and any future increases in the gas and car tax.

SECTION 2. VOTER APPROVAL FOR INCREASES IN GAS AND CAR TAX

Section 3.5 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution is added to read:

Sec. 3.5(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Legislature shall not impose, increase or extend any tax, as defined in section 3, on the sale, storage, use or consumption of motor vehicle gasoline or diesel fuel, or on the privilege of a resident of California to operate on the public highways a vehicle, or trailer coach, unless and until that proposed tax is submitted to the electorate and approved by a majority vote.

(b) This section does not apply to taxes on motor vehicle gasoline or diesel fuel, or on the privilege of operating a vehicle or trailer coach at the rates that were in effect on January 1, 2017. Any increase in the rate of such taxes imposed after January 1, 2017 shall cease to be imposed unless and until approved by the electorate as required by this section.

THE PROPONENTS OF THIS PROPOSED INITIATIVE MEASURE HAVE THE RIGHT TO WITHDRAW THE PETITION AT ANY TIME BEFORE THE MEASURE QUALIFIES FOR THE BALLOT.
